Holiday Giving at the Shelter



Did you know that the Sixth Street Shelter is a program of local anti-poverty nonprofit Community Action Lehigh Valley? Our mission is to improve the quality of life in the Lehigh Valley and surrounding areas by building communities in which all people have access to economic opportunity, the ability to pursue that opportunity, and a voice in the decisions that affect their lives.

We offer programs and services in:

Advocacy, Business Start-Up and Development, Food Access and Nutrition, Housing, Neighborhood Revitalization, and Youth.







Shalenie was living in New York with assistance from a Section 8 voucher, but after some time and unbeknownst to her, the housing authority stopped paying their part of the rent. This led to Shalenie and her family being evicted from their apartment, and she moved to Pennsylvania. Then, Shalenie's mother passed away in Georgia, and she had to take care of her severely disabled sister. Shalenie stayed with her brother until receiving a call from the Sixth Street Shelter offering help.

While staying at the Shelter, Shalenie managed to save up \$4,000 in the Shelter's Savings Program and also had another \$6,000 saved in an external account. Shalenie has a passion for cooking, especially baking. She shared that her dream is to open a restaurant, bakery, or food truck one day.

Her case manager, Dominique, introduced her to Chris Hudock from Community Action's business startup and development program, Rising Tide Community Loan Fund. Chris helped Shalenie get a business name and create a business plan for her venture, which she named "Gail's Kitchen" in honor of her mother.

We also connected Shalenie with Carmen Arroyo, who works for **Community Action's Housing Counseling program.** In January 2024, Shalenie completed the First Time Homebuyers Program and earned her certificate of completion. Even though Shalenie is not ready to buy a house just yet, she gets to keep her certificate and now has a basic understanding of the steps she'll need to take when she is ready to start that journey.

Shalenie is also planning to go back to school to study nursing, beginning March 2024. She is always working hard to improve herself, not just for her own sake, but for her family. She is currently on the hunt for an apartment to provide a new home for herself and her children.

Due to these ongoing needs, the Shelter consistently has a list of items in demand. These requirements may vary with the seasons or cater to the unique needs of our residents.
